Option	What is it?	Examples
Vocational / Trade School	<ul> <li>Trades are professions that require a great deal of skill, but that typically do not require a degree to enter</li> <li>organized educational programs offering a sequence of courses which are directly related to the preparation of individuals in paid or unpaid employment in current or emerging occupations requiring other than a baccalaureate or advanced degree."(2) While vocational education is provided at both the secondary and postsecondary levels, its focus differs somewhat at each level.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Agriculture</li> <li>Business and office</li> <li>Marketing and distribution</li> <li>Health</li> <li>Occupational home economics</li> <li>Trade and industry (including construction, mechanics and repairs, and precision production), and</li> <li>Technical and communications.</li> </ul>


Option	What is it?	Examples
2 Year College	<ul> <li>Institution of higher learning authorized to grant Associate's degrees.</li> <li>May also have certificate or certification programs.</li> <li>Also referred to as junior or community college.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>PGCC, Montgomery College, Howard Community College, etc.</li> </ul>
4 Year College	<ul> <li>Institution of higher learning authorized to grant Bachelor's, Master's, Doctoral, Law, Medical and other professional degrees.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Maryland, UMBC, Bowie State, Georgetown, Howard, American, etc.</li> </ul>

## Higher Education Options

Option	What is it?	Examples
Professional Certifications	<ul> <li>Learning targeted to an industry. Certifications usually require passing an exam. Some are self-study, some may require a class in order to prepare.</li> <li>Certifications are required by certain jobs and can lead to higher income within a job family.</li> <li>Professions where certifications can enhance your salary may or may not require a degree as a foundation</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Bookkeeper</li> <li>Network Engineer</li> <li>Cyber security</li> <li>Healthcare Data Entry</li> </ul>

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#### Warning: Avoid For-Profit Schools

- For-Profit schools offer a range of degree options; however, their mission is not to educate but to make a profit
- What does that mean?
  - Their goal is not to see you graduate, their goal is to keep you in school to make as much money as they can off of you
- How do they do that?
  - Volume the more students they have, the more they make
  - Lower level of services no on-campus housing, no academic counseling, lack of a proper campus, poor career services
  - Lower ratio of full professors (or experts in their field) teaching, leading to lack of (or non-standard) accreditation
  - Less merit aid and scholarships available, more students are full pay = more debt
  - Remaining eligible for financial aid, regardless of graduation rate or job placement rate
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

# Let's Break it Down: Places to Start

- Resources to research a college (The Basics)
  - College Website: <u>Cornell University</u>
    - Admissions Page
      - Freshman (or First Year or Perspective) Students, Transfer Students
      - Freshman or Transfer Requirements
      - Class Profile
      - Deadlines
      - Visit / Plan a Visit
      - Admissions Representatives (find a person to talk to)
      - ▶ Tuition / Financial Aid

# Let's Break it Down: Finding Your Fit

- "Fit" means how comfortable are you going to be at this college?
  - It is highly subjective. It's just important for you to figure out before you apply as it is to the admissions committee when reading your application
- Why? Colleges do not want you...
  - ... to be miserable.
  - ... to not be able to handle the coursework.
  - ... to transfer to another university because you didn't "fit"
- So what are some factors you should consider beyond the academics?

## Let's Break it Down: Sorting Fact from Fiction

- The higher a school's ranking (US News / Princeton Review) the better it is
- The price on a school's website is the price you will end up paying for college
- A school is a "reach" school for you if your ACT/SAT and GPA are within the middle 50%
- If you are recruited athlete, you do not have to complete an application for admission.
- You can only apply for financial aid if you don't have a lot of money.
- You can't get financial aid if you do have a lot of money (or think you make to much to qualify).

# Let's Break it Down: About those Rankings

- Rankings are a way to compare one thing against another
- Colleges are measured in many ways
  - US News and World Report
  - Sports (Coaching Polls)
  - Accreditation (AACSB, ABET, CAPACS, etc.)

# Remember Your Why

- Because completing college significantly improves your future career prospects, income potential, and

  - And contact me!


